
MALAYSIA ON SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS: ARE WE ON TRACK?

With an index score of 69.6 for 2019 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG), Malaysia ranks 68th out of 162 countries. Malaysia has embarked on more aggressive progress by entrenching SDGs in all facets of Malaysia's development in the new 11th Malaysia Plan. Great credit was given to Malaysia for putting SDG in high priority which also signified Malaysia's commitment towards SDG 2030.

Malaysia's Performance on

SDG – Malaysia scored lowest on 4 goals (all lower than 50 score), namely: Goal 2, Goal 10, Goal 14 and Goal 15. Besides that, Malaysia also faced major challenges in 6 out of 17 goals despite improving moderately most of other goals. However, it should be noted that Malaysia managed to maintain SDG achievement for Goal 1. More actions need to be taken for Malaysia to become a sustainable and prosperous country.






